Sung to "Have you Ever Seen a Lassie"

**Before singing have a few real or fake props or pictures, or draw a pumpkin, apple and potatoes on the white board.*

Verse One

Have you ever seen a pumpkin, a pumpkin, a pumpkin?

(On "Have you ever seen" shrug with palms upwards.

Point to a pumpkin picture or a real /fake pumpkin)

Have you ever seen a pumpkin, that grows on a vine?

(Point to a vine)

A round one, a tall one, a fat one, a small one.

(Use arms to make round, tall, fat and small)

Have you ever seen a pumpkin, that grows on a vine?

Verse Two

Have you ever seen an apple, an apple, an apple?

(Point to an apple image or a real apple)

Have you ever seen an apple, that grows on a tree?

(Point to a tree)

A round one, a tall one, a fat one, a small one.

Have you ever seen an apple that grows on a tree?

Verse Three

Have you ever seen potatoes, potatoes, potatoes?

Have you ever seen potatoes that grow under the ground?

A round one, a tall one, a fat one, a small one.

Have you ever seen a potato that grows under the ground?

Finger Play

This little piggy went to market

This little piggy stayed home

Chant

To market to market to buy a fat pig

(Clap on Pig)

Home again home again jiggety jig

(Clap on Jig)

To market to market to buy a fat hog

(Pat on Hog)

Home again home again jiggety jog

(Pat on Jog)

Autumn Leaves Are Falling Down

Sung to: "London Bridge is Falling Down"

Autumn leaves are falling down,
Falling down, falling down.

(Students stand, hold arms high then move while wiggling fingers like leaves falling down from branches).

Autumn leaves are falling down,
Down, down, on the ground.
(Crouch down low into a ball)

Rake them up and make a pile
Make a pile, make a pile.
(Move hands with fingers open wide in one direction like raking up leaves)

Rake them up and make a pile,
Guaranteed to make you smile!
(Make a big smile and point to your smile)

Turkey Pokey

Sung to "The Hokey Pokey"

You put your right wing in.
You put your right wing out.
You put your right wing in
And you shake it all about.
You do the Turkey Pokey and you turn yourself around
That's what its all about!

Additional verses:

Left wing (left arm)
Drumsticks (legs)
Stuffing (tummy)
Wattle (head)
Tail feathers (body)
Turkey body (whole self)

This is the Way we Carve a Pumpkin

Sung to "This is the Way"

(Draw a pumpkin on the board or use a pumpkin that has already been carved to demonstrate song.)

This is the way we scoop him out, scoop him out, scoop him out

(Pretend to scoop)

This is the way we scoop him out, early in the morning.

(Make a sunburst with hands on "early in the morning.")

This is the way we make his eyes, make his eyes, make his eyes

(Draw then point to eyes)

This is the way we make his eyes, early in the morning.

(Sunburst on early)

This is the way we make his nose, make his nose, make his nose,

(Draw then point to nose)

This is the way we make his nose, early in the morning

(Tap nose to the beat then make sunburst)

This is the way we make his mouth, make his mouth, make his mouth, *(Draw then*

point to mouth)

This is the way we make his mouth, early in the morning.

(Tap mouth to the beat then make sunburst)

Jack-o-lantern shining bright, shining bright, shining bright

(Point to the jack-o-lantern and flick hands like little bursts of light).

Jack-o-lantern shining bright, on this autumn night.

Five Little Pumpkins

Finger Play

Five little pumpkins sitting on a gate

The first one said, "Oh, my it's getting late"

The second one said, "There are shadows in the air"

The third one said, "But we don't care"

The fourth one said, "Let's run and run and run"

The fifth one said, "We're ready for some fun"

Then "Ooh" went the wind and out went the lights

And the five little pumpkins rolled out of sight

Let's Be Thankful

Sung to "Twinkle, Twinkle"

Let's be thankful for this day.

(place hands on heart on "thankful" and on "day" do a sunburst)

For our food and for our play

(hands on heart on "thankful" on "we can play" place hands over eyes as if playing "peek-a-boo")

Let's be thankful, let's be glad

(hands on heart then on "glad" show babies a big smile and point to it.)

For our food and all we have

(show students some real or pretend food then open arms outwards to show "all")

Let's give thanks for you and me

(hands on heart on "thanks" then point to "you" and "me")

And for our home and family

(Show or draw a picture of a home and stick family on the board and point to it).
